### **School Voluntary Contributions**

We very much appreciate your support for our school. As you would understand there are many ongoing costs associated with providing your children with classroom supplies, stationery, text books, equipment and photocopying. Notes will be going home today with the details. Please forward your contributions to the office as soon as practicable.

### 'Extend' -after school care

I have been seeking a before & after school care provider who would be willing to initiate care at our school. Extend offers a highly engaging care program. To secure this opportunity we would need an average of 12 students each day, if this number dropped the school would be required to make up the difference. Initially they would only offer after school care, but this may be extended to mornings also if the demand was there. The cost to the parents for an After School Care Session beginning at 3:30 and finishing at 6:00 would be \$26.00 per day. With the government subsidies parents receive, they will be out of pocket the following amounts based on income:

- \$42,000 = \$8.26
- $\bullet$  \$50.000 = \$8.70
- \$75,000 = \$9.78
- \$100,000 = \$10.86
- $\bullet$  \$125,000 = \$11.84
- \$145,000 = \$12.50
