Future Directions

As you would be aware we have spent considerable time planning our school's direction for the next three years. I want to make sure that everyone is quite clear on where we are headed and what will be the focus in the near future. Our three strategic directions are;

Lifelong Learning, Building Wellbeing & Community Connections.

Lifelong Learning is crucial to our desire to engage students in the learning process and motivate them to develop learning habits that will remain with them forever. It also highlights our own commitment as teachers to continual Professional Learning. The three main areas in Lifelong Learning we will focus on are How2Learn, the Australian Curriculum and Assessment & Reporting. Students, staff and parents will be offered training in each of these areas. As a part of this direction we were hoping to implement a new report format this term, but we have found we will need more consultation time so we are aiming for the end of the year reporting period.

Staff and student **Wellbeing** is vital to the harmonious running of our school. There are three areas of focus in Building Wellbeing; Resilience, Physical & Emotional Wellbeing and Behaviour Policies. Programs such as BluEarth, How2Learn and Sensory Awareness are being implemented and further training will be offered to staff and parents in this area in the near future.

Within the direction of **Community Connections** we are facilitating the expertise of local community members and partners to enhance a broad education for our students in the areas of the Environment, Aboriginal Education, the Arts, Sporting pursuits and Science.

Student Medical Information

Each year we are required to collect updated information on each student who has been identified with a medical condition such as asthma or allergies. I understand that sometimes the child's condition has not changed since last year but it is a legal requirement that we collect up to date information each year.

Each child who has been identified with a condition will be receiving a form which needs to be returned to school in the near future (unless it has already been received this year). If your child has a medical condition that we are unaware of, please contact the school.

Please ensure students are dressed in warm casual clothes and are at school by 9:20 on Thursday.


